Tips for taking Publicity Shots

- *Plan ahead.* Decide what message you want to convey, and find a way to capture it in a photo.
- *Take action shots.* They create more interest than posed shots of people shaking hands and standing and facing the camera.
- When taking photos to submit to the media, *keep deadlines in mind.* Include a caption with the correct spelling of names and a sentence explaining who, what, when, where, and why.


